COMMUNITY PROFILE

Winnipeg is the capital and largest city of the Canadian province of Manitoba. Its heart is The Forks, a historic site at the intersection of the Red and Assiniboine rivers, with warehouses converted to shops and restaurants, plus ample green space dedicated to festivals, concerts and exhibits. Winnipeg is a railway and transportation hub with a diversified economy. This multicultural city hosts numerous annual festivals, including the Jazz Winnipeg Festival, and the Winnipeg Fringe Theatre Festival. Its Exchange District is known for its well-preserved, early 20th-century architecture and numerous art galleries.
