Many tourists and boaters are attracted to the city because of its waterfront parks Couchiching Beach Park, Centennial Park, Port of Orillia and its close proximity to Lake Country, cottage country in Muskoka, Algonquin Provincial Park, and other natural attractions. The city's waterfront has an extensive lakeshore boardwalk, a large park with two beaches, several playgrounds, an outdoor theatre, and a touring ferry.
