Orillia is a city in Ontario in Simcoe County between Lake Couchiching and Lake Simcoe. It is known as the "Sunshine City". Orillia's "Art District" is home to a variety of art galleries, fine dining and shops. At its centre is the Orillia Museum of Art & History considered the hub of art and culture for the city. Many tourists and boaters are attracted to the city because of its waterfront parks Couchiching Beach Park, Centennial Park, Port of Orillia and its close proximity to Lake Country, cottage country in Muskoka, Algonquin Provincial Park, and other natural attractions. The city's waterfront has an extensive lakeshore boardwalk, a large park with two beaches, several playgrounds, an outdoor theatre, and a touring ferry.
